

Project Community Advisory Group - 2024 design summary

Albury Wodonga Regional Hospital project

November 2024



The Project Community Advisory Group met seven times throughout the past 12 months to discuss and understand different aspects of the project.

The Albury Wodonga Regional Hospital Project Community Advisory Group (PCAG) was established to provide feedback on the planning and design of the new hospital from a patient, lived experience, and community perspective.

The PCAG was made up of community representatives from across the Albury Wodonga Health catchment area and reflect the diversity and unique character of the border communities.

Following an expression of interest and an extensive selection panel assessment process, the group was formed in September 2023.

Since then, the group has provided valuable feedback including on planning and design features, accessibility and communications.

The main topics for each of the seven meetings were:

- 1. PCAG kick-off meeting
- 2. Guided tour and Master Plan briefing
- 3. Concept design workshop with Hassell Architects
- 4. Project communications and engagement workshop
- 5. Arts and landscape design workshop with Hassell Architects
- 6. Concept design release community engagement approach
- 7. Project update, previous concept design engagement outcomes, Social Impact Assessment in-depth interview




Figure 1: Landscaping workshop

For each design workshop, PCAG feedback was distilled into key points. Below is a summary of their input, along with the project team's responses detailing how each point will be integrated into the project.
